Updates on various boards/commissions/activities since the last meeting: Keifer attended the Floyd-Mitchell-Chickasaw Landfill meeting. Kuhn attended the Veteran's Day event at the Charles City Middle School.

Keifer moved to approve Drainage District #3 Main Open Ditch Repair Project Change Order #3 with a net deduct of \$930.21. Motion carried 3-0.

Keifer/Jorgensen moved to approve Drainage District #3 Main Open Ditch Repair Project Pay Ap #12 for \$17,653.31. Motion carried 3-0. Brian Wulff mentioned items that were left unaddressed including a main tile, a tile by the railroad tracks, east side of Jordan Wulff's property, rough terrain left from the excavator, and no riprap along Jordan's property as well. Boyd Campbell visited onsite with Merlyn Schweizer and Curtis Marth at an area where the railroad goes across the ditch and no trees were addressed and soil build-up has dammed water about two foot deep; Auditor Carr read an e-mail from Tyler Conley, Bolton & Menk engineer, who responded that it is much more cost effective for the railroad to take responsibility of their right-of-way rather than the district to obtain a

permit from the railroad and suggested the Board submit a letter to the local railroad field office requesting the maintenance be addressed. Parties will provide Carr with specific information on areas of concern, with pictures if possible, to provide to Conley prior to the closing hearing.

The Board reviewed an invoice from Ahlers & Cooney regarding fees for services in the lawsuit against the Iowa Utilities Commission regarding the Summit Carbon Pipeline permit. Two more counties have joined the effort, bringing the total to nine. Keifer/Jorgensen moved to approve the invoice from Ahlers & Cooney for professional services regarding the Judicial Review of Iowa Utilities Commission Permit lawsuit. Motion carried 3-0. Kuhn will follow up on the status of the case.

County Attorney Todd Prichard and Carr provided information on filling the vacated shared assistant position between the two offices. Prichard has posted a position for a full-time or part-time position for an administrative assistant. Carr has posted for a part-time clerk position which would allow the next auditor to start earlier than January 2 and then leave it up to the new auditor to determine whether to hire a part-time person or share a full-time position with the county attorney.

The Board noted the receipt of the Post-Election Audit/Auditor Certification of the November 5, 2024 General Election. The Iowa Secretary of State's office informed Carr that the Rudd-Floyd-Cedar-Niles precinct was selected for the audit and directed the President/Vice President and County Sheriff races be hand counted. The audit team conducted the audit which resulted in a 100% match of the hand-count of the ballots compared to the election night machine-count. Carr stated these audits have been conducted since 2018 and all have proven a 100% accuracy of the tabulating devices.

Future agenda items: Compensation Board appointments, Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council election recap, Elderbridge Agency on Aging FY26 budget request, and transition of Jorgensen's appointments to various boards and commissions.

Jorgensen/Keifer moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
