Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Carr attended an Area Development Corporation meeting. Campbell attended NIACOG Transportation Policy, Emergency Planning and Response meetings. Keifer attended a FMC Landfill meeting.

Annette Dean, Charles City Library Director, presented the library’s request and spoke on behalf of the Floyd County Library Association. The agency is requesting a 3% budget increase to offset inflation. Without the additional funding, they anticipate cutting back on programs. In attendance was Elaine Ott – Marble Rock Library, Renee Bartling – Nora Springs Library, Emily Deetz – Rockford Library and Kathy Smith – Rudd Library.

Mike Quade, Floyd County Fair Board president, presented the agency treasurer’s report, improvements over the last two years and their “To Do” list. The agency is requesting the county maintain the \$10,000 contribution to the fair and the \$12,000 for the collection site in FY26.

Mark Wicks, Main Street Charles City representative, provided information on the agency with a \$5,000 FY26 funding request. Wicks commented that Charles City ranks second in volunteer hours across 53 cities in the state program. The national value for volunteer time per hour is \$22.73 per Independent Sector.

The board discussed the Law Enforcement 28E Agreement. The following participated with the board in this discussion: Marble Rock Mayor Jerry Engelhardt, Sheriff Jeff Crooks, Chief Deputy Pat Shirley, and Lieutenant Travis Bartz and Nora Springs Mayor Randall Hassman and Chief of Police Jesse Dugan. It was recommended to increase the per capita agreements for the cities of Colwell, Floyd, Marble Rock, Rockford and Rudd from \$7 to \$9 and the per hour with Nora Springs agreement from \$50 to \$65. Carr will set up a meeting with the mayors and Sheriff for the purpose of establishing a 5-year fee schedule.

Supervisor Keifer will contact the County Attorney to draft the moratorium for solar energy.

Adam Sears, Conservation Director, provided an update on the Conservation department activities.

The Board recessed at 11:05 a.m. and reconvened at 11:10 a.m.

The Board conducted FY25 budget revenues for the following departments: REAP, Conservation, Conservation Rev and Public Health.

The Board recessed at 1:30 p.m. and reconvened at 2 p.m.

The Board continued with budget reviews for the following departments: Recorder, Health Board, Planning & Zoning, E911 Surcharge, 911, Veteran Affairs, Treasurer, and Dispatch

Future agenda items: Solar Energy Moratorium
