Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Carr has the following meetings: 28E Law Enforcement fees, Iowa Governmental Health Care Program, and Iowa Workforce Development. Campbell attended the Emergency Management Commission meeting. Keifer attended a department head meeting. All three supervisors attended the Assessor Conference Board meeting.

Joe Venz, First MainStreet Insurance representative, and Jon Vrieze, Sisson & Associates representative, presented the general insurance services they could provide to the county. They also discussed the available process options and outlined what the next steps would look like if the county decided to continue with the quote process.

The board discussed the weed control plan for the upcoming year in the drainage districts. Concerns were raised about the need for extra caution to avoid contaminating the water source. It was noted that drones may not be the most effective option for this purpose, and the board expressed interest in exploring ground rig operations as an alternative. B&W Control Specialist, based in Algona, was recommended by Tyler at Bolton & Menk as a potential service provider. Keifer was tasked with contacting the company to obtain a quote. Auditor Miller will reach out to other resources as well.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve the liquor license renewal application for Freeze Frame Bowl. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Campbell moved to set the Special Election Canvas for March 1 at 10 a.m. in the boardroom. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve three cameras totaling \$1,526.98 and a surveillance sign for \$8.99 for the Rockford site, to be paid with Communications Tower Project bond proceeds. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Campbell moved to approve Motorola Change Order #7 to add 26 APX900 portable radios and accessories for \$72,877.66, offset by credits for returned accessories and cancellation of six vehicular chargers totaling \$48,240.17, for a net change of \$24,637.49, to be paid with bond proceeds. Motion carried 3-0.

The board reviewed the impact on property tax rates if a 2.75% raise was given, if all requested raises were granted, and a \$25,000 additional allocation to Emergency Management.

Future agenda items: Conservation update, Iowa Governmental Health Care Plan presentation, and Cedar Ridge liquor license renewal.

Campbell/Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
