The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Board Room of the Floyd County Courthouse. Supervisors Dennis Keifer, Boyd Campbell, and Gloria Carr were in attendance.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 3-0.

Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Carr reported the on Iowa Child Abuse Prevention Program grant application being filed, seeking information on new mental health advocate requirements, meeting with Public Health Administrator Gail Arjes regarding FY26 wages, and attending the following meetings: NIACOG, Charles City Council hearing regarding housing project and ISAC legislative webinar. Campbell participated in the wind energy and battery storage workgroup meeting. Keifer attended Floyd Mitchell Chickasaw Landfill and Charles City Chamber of Commerce meetings.

Campbell/ Carr moved to approve Res #06-25* to Embargo River Road: The Board has determined the need to impose weight restrictions on certain highways to prevent damage caused by climatic conditions. To protect public infrastructure, the Board has resolved to establish a load limit of five tons per axle on designated roads. The County Engineer is instructed to install and maintain appropriate signage, enforcing these restrictions annually until further notice. Specifically, the embargo applies to River Road from Quarry Rd. and 150th St., extending west to River Rd. and north to 130th St. Adam Miller, County Engineer, researched Iowa Code to confirm this can be enforced on an annual basis until further notice. Roll call vote: Ayes-Carr, Campbell, Keifer. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/ Campbell moved to approve Res #07-25* County Engineer Designation/Authorization on Behalf of the Board of Supervisors to Approve Projects: The Board has authorized County Engineer Adam Miller to certify the completion and final acceptance of all Farm-to-Market and state or federally funded construction projects in accordance with approved plans and specifications. Roll call vote: Ayes-Carr, Campbell, Keifer. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/ Carr moved to approve Res# 08-25* Pavement Marking Bids for project FM-CO34(118)--55-34: The Board determined a countywide pavement marking project to be in the best interest of the county and its residents. After following the necessary legal procedures, the Board has accepted a bid of \$146,829.74 from Vogel Traffic Services Inc. and awarded the contract accordingly. Additionally, Floyd County Engineer Adam Miller, P.E., is authorized to execute all necessary contract documents on behalf of the Board. Roll call vote: Ayes-Carr, Campbell, Keifer. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve the Family Farm Tax Credit Application from Scott, Amanda, and Andy Glaser. Motion carried 3-0.

The Board discussed invoices from Ahlers & Cooney. Keifer had called to inquire about phase two of the pipeline and right-of-way ordinances. Carr/ Campbell moved to approve the payment to Ahlers Cooney invoice for \$116.99 for Judicial Review of IUC Permit and \$117.00 for Pipeline and Row Ordinances.

The Board discussed radio systems training for the new tower. Dispatch training took place last Friday, and the tower was switched over at 6 p.m. on Friday, March 7.

The board reviewed information provided by Cerro Gordo County Attorney Carlyle Dalen regarding payment owed to them for their 90% share of services on behalf of Floyd County in collecting payments on Floyd

County cases totaling \$56,082.60 from July 2022 through October 2024 and reimbursement of \$1,714.90 claimed to be an erroneous payment they made to Floyd County in FY23. The board also reviewed the 28E agreement for Cerro Gordo's services on administration of Floyd County's collections cases presented by former Floyd County Attorney Rachel Ginbey and approved by the board in 2022. Floyd County Attorney Todd Prichard is reviewing Dalen's information. Carr mentioned the county attorney collection incentive fund has no budget for expenses but Prichard could make a partial payment with Board approval to shift \$5,000, as allowed per Iowa Code without requiring a budget amendment, and issue a check to Cerro Gordo County in the short term but, the board would have to amend the FY25 budget in order to pay any remaining payment due to Cerro Gordo County. Discussion included conflicting verbiage in the 28E agreement reading Cerro Gordo County collects the funds and reimburses Floyd County 10% of those funds, verification on Clerk of Court FIN codes, the county fund/department where revenue was received, and the impact this has on the County's general fund. Campbell suggested not paying Cerro Gordo County anything until Prichard can report to the Board on his findings and options for payment.

The board noted the Post-Election Audit Report/Auditor Certification of Central Springs Community School District & North Butler Community School District Special Election. Auditor Miller reported on the accuracy of the election equipment with the results of the special precinct board's hand-counted ballots matching 100% to the election night equipment-counted results.

Future agenda items: Future agenda items: discussion with county attorney regarding 28E collections by Cerro Gordo County and Extension on Utility Scale Wind Energy Systems moratorium.

The board took a 5-minute break.

Carr/ Campbell moved to recess our regular meeting and proceed with the March 4, Special Election Canvass. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/ Campbell moved to resume regular meeting. Motion carried 3-0.

The Board discussed reducing the proposed maximum tax asking and adjusting employee wages. They also considered cutting funding for certain agencies and determining allocations for the county attorney collection incentive fund, the mental health advocate, and the Area Development Corp.

Campbell/ Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors/Canvassers met for Canvass of the March 4, 2025 Central Springs Community School District & North Butler Community School District Special Election in the Board Room of the Floyd County Courthouse. Supv Keifer announced the canvass and Auditor Miller presented canvass materials including election night reports, precinct tally books, and abstracts for review.

Campbell/Carr approved the agenda. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/ Campbell moved to approve Res #09-25* Certification of Floyd County Election Result: Central Springs Community School District & North Butler Community School District Special Elections were held as prescribed by law on March 4, 2025, and the Board of Supervisors and exofficio Board of Canvassers have canvassed the vote of said elections in accordance with Iowa Code 50.24; Be it resolved that the Board of Supervisors/Board of Canvassers hereby certify the voter turnout and the Tier 1 Canvass for the Special Election held March 4, 2025 and that no obvious clerical errors were identified during the canvass.

Turnout: Central Springs CSD-223 voters; No. Butler CSD-6 voters; Grand Total-229 voters. Voters of the respective districts: Central Springs CSD Public Measure WP-Yes=167 and No=56; No. Butler CSD Public Measure CS-Yes=1 and No=5.

Be it further resolved that the Floyd County Auditor/Commissioner of Elections shall maintain the Official Canvass and Abstracts for the March 4, 2025 Special Election. Roll call vote: Ayes-Carr, Campbell, Keifer. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/ Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
