Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Carr attended the North Iowa Workforce Development and an ambulance meeting. Keifer attended the Landfill meeting and met with fire departments about the new communication system. Campbell attended the NIACOG Transportation Policy Board, North Central Regional Emergency Planning District Committee and Response Commission meetings.

Campbell/Carr moved to table any action regarding Noxious Weed publication. Motion carried 3-0.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, presented the Floyd County Iowa Department of Transportation budget and five year plan. Carr/Campbell moved to approve the FY26 Iowa Department of Transportation Secondary Road Budget. Motion carried 3-0. Campbell/Carr moved to approve the FY26 Iowa Department of Transportation Secondary Road Five Year Program. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve signing final plans for Bridge Replacement Project BROS-C034(109)--8J-34 on 170th Street over Flood Creek. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve the 2025 Crushed Stone Resurfacing project awarding the bid to Bruening Rock Products for \$1,187,175 (75,000 tons at \$15.829 per ton). Motion carried 3-0.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, provided updates on Secondary Roads crews have finished pouring culvert sections for the season and will begin fabricating new forms. Brush removal continues, and bridge work includes clearing around piers. Sign trailers have been ordered and are expected in early June. Updates are also underway for mechanic shop uniforms. Office activities include completed ROW for the 170th Street Bridge and DOT letting for B60 & T26 resurfacing scheduled for tomorrow. Contract rock was let April 8th, and notices have been sent for the proposed Apple Lane road vacation. A landowner offered to buy two closed bridges on 130th Street, but Todd Prichard, County Attorney, advised removal due to liability.

The Board discussed the Drainage District 3 project. Landowners inquired whether remaining work was completed as discussed at the December 16, 2024 meeting. Tyler Conley, Bolton & Menk engineer/project manager confirmed the contractor has not completed the work but plans to soon. Conley will give Larson Campbell's contact info to follow up on the project. He'll also look for a local contact for the Canadian Pacific portion and share proof of prior contact with the railroad and Larson from last December. Keifer will send a second letter to the railroad on behalf of the Board, which will follow up on the status in a few weeks. No action was taken.

Carr/Campbell moved to appoint Gail Arjes, Public Health Director, to take on General Assistance duties effective either when County Social Services is no longer available or on July 1, 2025, whichever comes first. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Campbell moved to recertify the wages of Bernie Solomon, IT Director FY25 Salary retroactive to July 1 2024 for \$70,000. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve the Marco contract for new phones, with monthly payments of \$1,916 over a 60-month term. Motion carried 3-0.

The board noted the termination of Nicole Hamm, dispatcher effective April 7 2025.

The board discussed the FY26 proposed budget notice. Campbell/Carr moved to direct Auditor Miller to submit the proposed budget notice in the county's official papers. Motion carried 3-0.

Future agenda items: noxious weed notice.

The Board reviewed historic graphs with revenues and expense back to FY06 and through FY26's proposed budget prepared by Carr.

Campbell/Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
