Updates regarding various boards, commissions, and activities since the last meeting: Carr attended an Area Development Corp Asset Management meeting and presented at the Prairie Day Camp at the Carrie Chapman Catt House. Campbell attended an FMC Landfill meeting and is working to coordinate a meeting with contractors on Drainage District 3. Neupert participated in the 911 Service Board meeting.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, provided an update on road and office activities. Shoulder work on B60 has been completed for the year. Culvert work on Packard is scheduled to begin this week, and storm damage repairs are underway, with the Timber Avenue culvert south of 240th Street expected to be replaced soon. Carr expressed concern about weeds and trees in ditches, noting a clear difference in maintenance across county lines. Miller will review neighboring county budgets to explore possible improvements. In construction updates, Heartland Asphalt completed paving on T38 last Friday, reopening the road, and also finished paving B47, with shoulders and painting expected this week. Mathy Construction tentatively began work on B60 yesterday. Kingland Construction continues work on the Rockford Shop, and Vogel Traffic Services has started road painting for the 2025 season.

Adam Sears, Conservation Director, provided an update on the Conservation department activities.

Campbell opened the public hearing regarding FY26 County Budget Amendment at 9:47 am. There were no comments. Campbell closed public hearing.

Carr/Neupert moved approve Res #36-25\* FY26 County Budget Amendment: The County FY26 budget has certain line items in need of adjustment since the original budget was certified on April 29, 2025; and the Board timely published notice and held a public hearing on August 12, 2025 for the FY25 county budget amendment; Be it resolved that the Board adopts the FY26 Amendment and approves a 100% appropriation of \$720,000 in expenditures for the non-departmental budget. Roll call vote: Ayes-Carr, Campbell, Neupert; motion carried 3-0.

The Board noted the resignation of Conservation Aide Carter Burkhardt, effective August 6, 2025.

Future agenda item: An update with Tim Whipple, Thomas S. Reavely – Whitfield & Eddy Law Invoice, Assistant County Attorney, and Drainage District 3 update.

Carr/Neupert moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
