The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Floyd County Courthouse Board Room. Supervisors Boyd Campbell, Gloria Carr, and Joshua Neupert were in attendance.

Carr/Neupert moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 3-0.

Neupert/Carr moved to approve September 9, 2025 meeting minutes. Motion carried 3-0.

Updates regarding various boards, commissions, and activities since the last meeting: Carr attended the Foster Grandparents Award Ceremony. Campbell met with Curt Marth to assess the boundary of Drainage District #18, but no clear boundary was identified. Campbell also attended the FMC Landfill and FMC Early Childhood meeting.

Neupert/Campbell moved to approve a \$68.59 reimbursement for the Attorney's Office training meal, citing Floyd County Public Purpose Policy Section 2.A. Motion carried 3-0. The Board noted that such expenses should be presented for approval prior to being incurred.

Campbell/Carr moved to approve Resolution 37-25\* Approval of Compromise Settlement Agreement: The Board approved a compromise settlement agreement related to ongoing litigation involving the Central Iowa Juvenile Detention Center (CIJDC). The agreement, previously approved by the CIJDC Commission, aims to resolve disputes over the validity of past 28E agreements. It recognizes counties that joined CIJDC through 2012 and provides a path for other counties to retain certain benefits and potentially regain full membership. The Board supports the agreement and authorizes CIJDC to present a consent decree to the court reflecting the settlement terms. Roll call vote: Ayes-Carr, Campbell, Neupert; motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Neupert moved to authorize Secondary Roads to inspect and, if necessary, repair a potentially plugged tile in Drainage District 9. Motion carried 3-0.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, informed the Board that one Assistant to the Engineer received a job offer from Bremer County. Current assistant wages are Jake Johnson at \$34.98/hour and Duane Folz at \$37.12/hour. Miller proposed increasing both to \$42.30/hour at 37.5 hours/week. Campbell moved to raise their wages to \$39.60/hour at 40 hours/week, but the motion was withdrawn. Campbell/Neupert moved to approve an increase to both assistants' wages to \$42.30/hour at 37.5 hours/week, effective September 29, 2025. Motion carried 3-0. Carr requested Miller to explore transitioning the positions from hourly to salaried.

Amy Assink, County Recorder, again requested to advertise a full-time replacement for the Recorder's Clerk. After discussing a shared full-time position with Auditor Montagne, both agreed it would not benefit either office. The Board discussed hiring a part-time employee instead. Campbell asked Assink to explore part-time options; Neupert agreed with this plan. Carr/Neupert moved to approve advertising for a part-time Recorder's Clerk position, up to 29 hours per week. Motion carried 3-0. Assink also asked the Board to consider similar staffing cuts across departments of comparable size during budget season.

The Board noted the hiring of Sheriff Deputy Jordan Johnson, effective September 29, 2025, with a starting salary of \$61,569. Upon certification through the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy, his salary will increase to \$67,605.

The Board noted the upcoming retirement of Assistant County Attorney, Randy Tilton, effective September 30, 2025.

Neupert/Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
