October 14, 2025, 9:00 a.m.

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Floyd County Courthouse Board Room. Supervisors Boyd Campbell, Gloria Carr, and Frank Rottinghaus were in attendance.

Carr/Rottinghaus moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 3-0.

Updates regarding various boards, commissions, and activities since the last meeting: Carr attended the Pipeline Safety and Foster Grandparent meetings, as well as a Suspicious Mail Training. Campbell attended the FMC Landfill meeting. Rottinghaus attended the Charles City Main Street meeting.

Travis Bartz, Sheriff's Deputy, presented the need for new laptops in the Sheriff's Dept. Rottinghaus/Carr moved to approve sponsoring a Community Foundation Grant for the Sheriff's Office. Motion carried 3-0.

Bartz provided an update on the communications tower project. The tower is now operational, and SEARS (School Emergency Alert Radio System) radios have been set up in all Floyd County schools. Ongoing training is being conducted to ensure effective use of the system.

Bartz and others are working to reduce communication tower maintenance contract costs and have contacted the bond representative to explore funding options for equipment such as laptops, body cameras, and in-car cameras. Concerns were raised about reduced state funding in the 911 accounts, which may affect the ability to cover upcoming expenses. To help offset costs, the Sheriff's Department is applying for several grants. Jason Webster, EMA Coordinator, proposed upgrading tornado sirens to allow dispatchers to activate them remotely. For example, in Charles City, the activation button was previously located in City Hall and is now at the fire department. During severe weather, emergency personnel need to be available throughout the county, not racing to a manual switch. Most sirens currently require manual activation. Webster also suggested installing a weather-monitoring camera on the communications tower in Rockford.

Tim Laube, Weed Commissioner, presented the 2025 Weed Commissioner's Report. The Board requested clarification on total herbicide expenses and which herbicides were used under the Weed Commissioner versus the County Engineer. Laube will follow up with the State Weed Commissioner for guidance. Carr/Rottinghaus moved to suspend action on the report until October 28, 2025. Motion carried 3-0.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, provided an update on Secondary Road Activities. A safety meeting is scheduled for October 21. Vehicle updates include the sale of a 2000 F-250 ending today and the purchase of a 2011 F-250 with 46,000 miles via auction. Construction projects are progressing: Mathy is finishing paving on B60 this week, with painting to follow, and Kingland Construction is completing work on the Rockford Shop. Sign requests were reviewed for T38 north of Hwy 14, Glass Ave north of Rudd, and Niles Corner toward Underwood Ave; the Board directed Miller to order six additional signs. A speed limit report for 195th Street west of Gilbert was submitted and will be discussed on October 28. The snow removal policy was also reviewed. Carr requested an update on the Walnut Ave closure, which has since been repaired and reopened.

Rottinghaus/Carr moved to approve Res # 41-25\* Notice of Withdrawal from 28E Agreement and Approval of Termination of Region: The Board approved Floyd County's withdrawal from the Third Amended and Restated 28E Agreement establishing County Social Services, following changes in state law that eliminated the regional format for mental health service delivery. As of July 1, 2025, County Social Services no longer provides services to Floyd County. The region will be terminated on June 30, 2026, or once all liabilities are paid and assets distributed, whichever occurs first. Roll call vote: Ayes – Carr, Campbell, Rottinghaus; motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Rottinghaus moved to set the Tier 1 canvass for November 12 at 10:00 a.m. and the Tier 2 canvass for November 18 at 10:00 a.m., both to be held in the Floyd County Courthouse Board Room for the November 4 City/School Election. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Rottinghaus moved to pay the \$632.97 for lodging from the last visit and printing to Prochaska & Associates, Inc. Motion carried 3-0. The board will request a public meeting with Prochaska & Associates, Inc regarding the charge of \$2,508.39 for construction administration.

The Board noted the resignation of Jailer, Cassidy Wegner effective October 10, 2025.

Future agenda items: Right-of-way ordinance, continuation of 3<sup>rd</sup> reading of zoning ordinance, and Weed Commissioner Report, and 195<sup>th</sup> Street Speed Limit.

Carr/Rottinghaus moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
