The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Floyd County Courthouse Board Room. Supervisors Boyd Campbell, Gloria Carr, and Frank Rottinghaus were in attendance.

Updates regarding various boards, commissions, and activities since the last meeting: Carr attended the FMC CPPC planning meeting and the Decat Governance Board meeting. Campbell attended the North Cedar Aviation Authority meeting. All three supervisors participated in the Secondary Road Union negotiations.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, provided an update. The S70 stump removal project has been completed, and brushing work is ongoing, while snow removal has been minimal over the past two weeks. The department received 17 applications for the open position, with eight candidates scheduled for interviews and plans to make an offer within the next week. The bridges on 130th Street have been closed for more than 10 years, and the plan is to remove them once it is confirmed whether they are considered historic structures. Design work for the B45 bridges is progressing, with a target letting date in 2026; soil boring quotes are being obtained, and boring will begin soon to

start the foundation design. The budget is currently being prepared, and Floyd County received an award for producing 51,000 tons of asphalt.

Jessie Holm, County Treasurer, introduced a proposed wage increases for multiple employees following a restructure of duties. Carr expressed concerns about implementing mid-year increases and referenced the need for a wage study, noting that she has not observed an increase in duties. Rottinghaus requested specific details regarding the changes in responsibilities and largely agreed with Carr's position. No action was taken.

Jessy Willadsen, Zoning Administrator, requested that the Board hire Lynch Dallas Legal to draft recommended revisions to the County's Nuisance Ordinance. Carr asked Willadsen to contact other counties for examples of stronger ordinances and to research and propose updates for Board review before legal counsel examines them. The Board expressed interest in reviewing the ordinance, but no action was taken.

The Board discussed items related to the January 2 Organizational Meeting to ensure the meeting runs smoothly.

Future agenda items: Appointments to Boards and Commissions and Supervisor appointments for new year. Rottinghaus/Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
