Updates regarding various boards, commissions, and activities since the last meeting: Carr attended the following meetings: Workforce Development Board, North Central Regional Emergency Response (Hazmat) Commission and Planning Committee, Region 2 Transportation Policy Board, Floyd County Medical Center Strategic Planning, and Zoning Dept transition group. Rottinghaus worked with Downing Excavation on Drainage District 9, attended the Main Street Charles City board meeting, and investigated a nuisance complaint. All three members of the Board of Supervisors attended the Assessor Board meeting.

Tammy Tincher, NACo Director of Membership Engagement, presented NACo and the benefits it offers its members in the county, cities and other entities, as well as the residents in Floyd County.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve the FY27 Iowa Department of Transportation Secondary Road Budget. Motion carried 3-0. Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve the FY27 Iowa Department of Transportation Secondary Road Five-Year Program. Motion carried 3-0.

Adam Miller, County Engineer, provided a Secondary Roads update including crews working on culvert sections, blading roads, and B45/Hwy 14 stump removal and ditch regrading. Other projects include reviewing fuel management at shops and seeking bids for a new trailer to haul pipe and equipment. CVTC's new generator is now operational. Miller and office staff are working on construction design projects, FY26 budget amendment, 130th St road vacation, sign policy, planning monthly KCHA radio interviews and reviewing the RAISE grant funding agreement. Miller informed the board of a \$1,404,104 award of a Competitive Highway Bridge Program Grant.

Carr opened the FY27 County Budget public hearing at 10:19 a.m. No public comment was received. Carr closed the hearing at 10:22 a.m.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve Res 10-26\* Approval of Elected Officials FY27 Salaries: County Attorney (Part-Time) at \$94,494 (6.5% increase); Auditor at \$83,993 (2.9%), Recorder at \$82,133 (2.9%), Treasurer at \$82,656 (2.9%), Sheriff at \$128,571 (6.5%), and Supervisors at \$42,231 (2.5%). Roll call vote – Ayes: Carr, Rottinghaus, Campbell; motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve Res 11-26\* Adoption of FY27 County Budget and Certification of Taxes: The Board adopts the FY27 budget following review of revenues, expenditures, valuations, property tax levies, and other budget-related factors. The Board confirms that the required public hearings for the proposed property tax levy and budget were properly published and held on March 24, 2026, and April 14, 2026. The adopted FY27 budget does not exceed the property tax dollars presented at the March 24, 2026 public hearing and is approved as published. Roll call vote – Ayes: Carr, Rottinghaus, Campbell; motion carried 3-0.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve a Mental Health Advocate Memorandum of Understanding between Floyd County and Howard County, including Floyd County's appointment of Stephanie Kuhn. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve regarding Ahlers & Cooney invoice of \$750.48 for Judicial Review of IUC Permit. Motion carried 3-0.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve a Memorandum of Understanding between the Floyd County Assessor's Office, Planning and Zoning Department, and the Board of Supervisors for the intake of building permits. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve the renewal liquor license application for Rustic Acres. Motion carried 3-0.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to adopt the updated Floyd County Employee & County-Owned Vehicle Parking Policy. Motion carried 3-0.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to adopt the updated Floyd County Courthouse & Law Enforcement Center Entrance/Exit Policy. Motion carried 3-0.

Tyron Steere, Conservation Director, provided a Conservation department update. Proposed changes to an ordinance establishing rules and regulations for conservation areas were discussed.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to set a FY26 budget amendment public hearing for May 12 at 9:30 a.m. in the Floyd County Courthouse Boardroom. Motion carried 3-0.

The Board noted a pay increase for Jailer, Tyler Mack from \$24 to \$25 per hour effective March 27 upon completion of training.

The Board noted the resignation of PRN Dispatcher Jamie Ekwall effective April 30.

The Board noted the resignation of Driver's License Clerk Shelby Haberkorn effective May 1.

Future agenda items: NACo Membership and NIACOG FY25 Audit.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to adjourn at 11:54 a.m. Motion carried 3-0.
