April 28, 2026, 9:00 a.m.

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Floyd County Courthouse Board Room. Supervisors Gloria Carr, Boyd Campbell, and Frank Rottinghaus were in attendance.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve the agenda. Motion carried 3-0.

Public comment: None.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve the April 21, 2026 minutes. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve the claims: County #2318-2357 and Engineer #10637-10647.

Updates regarding various boards, commissions, and activities since the last meeting: Carr attended meetings of the Area Development Corporation, Wellness Committee, Dispatch, North East Iowa Workforce Development Finance. Rottinghaus participated in Ambulance Commission meeting. Carr and Campbell attended a meeting with department heads and ReGov representatives.

Rottinghaus updated the Board on Drainage District #9, noting the issue has been identified but repairs are delayed due to excess water. Downing Excavating declined to proceed with the project. Zimmerman's Digging and Demolition was identified to complete the repair. A certified letter will be sent to a landowner believed to have conducted work on district tile on their property.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve the funding agreement for Raise Grant Projects: HDP-C034(111)--6B-34, HDP-C034(112)--71-34, HDP-C034(113)--71-34, HDP-C034(114)--6B-34, HDP-C034(115)--71-34, HDP-C034(116)--6B-34, HDP-C034(117)--6B-34. Motion carried 3-0.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to approve Res # 12-26* Bridge Load Posting for bridge 153660: The Board approved to reduce the posted weight limits on certain secondary road bridges based on inspection findings indicating structural deterioration. This action authorizes the placement and maintenance of weight limit signs for Bridge No. 153660, posting multiple limits of 10 tons, 15 tons, and 15 tons on a one-lane structure. Roll call vote – Ayes: Rottinghaus, Campbell, Carr. Motion carried 3-0.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve the revised Floyd County Sign Maintenance Policy. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Rottinghaus moved to set a public hearing for the vacation of Timber Avenue south of 130th Street in S5-T96-R15 for May 19 at 9:15 am in the Floyd County Courthouse Board Room. Motion carried 3-0.

Miller provided an update on Secondary Road and office activities. Road work included routine blading, minor frost boil repairs, and ditch cleaning, with all work orders being minor. Office updates included ongoing construction and design work, coordination with Denco on pavement maintenance, a bridge project on 170th Street south of Rudd under contract and possibly starting in May, and replacement of a window air conditioning unit at the collection site.

John Westrope, co-owner of ReGov Solutions, LLC, provided an overview of ReGov and its development of software for Iowa counties. Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to enter into the ReGov Iowa Pre-Release Software Program Agreement. Motion carried 3-0.

The Board recognized Todd Schriever, Veterans Affairs Director, for his assistance to a veteran’s family and for his service to the veterans he supports.

Rottinghaus/Campbell moved to approve the second amendment to the Child Support Services County Staffing Contract Between the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services, Child Support Services and Floyd County. Motion carried 3-0.

Auditor Montagne presented one sealed bid for audit services received from Gardiner & Company. Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to accept the Gardiner & Company bid for auditing services for FY26 at \$47,650, FY27 at \$51,460, and FY28 at \$55,575, along with FMC Empowerment services for \$2,220, \$2,400, and \$2,595 for FY26, FY27, and FY28, respectively. Motion carried 3-0.

Tyler Trout, Charles City Administrator, and Rottinghaus provided an update from the Ambulance Commission meeting. The Commission is awaiting a formal contract from AMR for review. Discussion also included a proposed study to be shared with the City of Charles City, noting PCG as a more established firm compared to Emergency Management, which submitted a lower quote.

Jason Webster, Emergency Management Coordinator, and John Gohr, Dispatch Supervisor, addressed the Board regarding staffing needs following the resignation of a part-time employee. They recommended hiring a full-time dispatcher to prepare for the planned retirement of two additional dispatchers within the next year. Gohr indicated sufficient funds are available in the budget to support a full-time position. The Board also discussed the potential transition of Gohr from a salaried supervisory role to a lead, hourly position effective July 1.

The Board noted the hiring of Conservation Aides Carter Burkhardt and Clay Price at a rate of \$14 per hour, effective May 4.

The Board noted a pay increase for Jailer Alyssa Collins upon completion of training, from \$24 to \$25 per hour, effective April 18.

The Board noted a pay increase for Auditor’s Clerk Ann Wagner from \$21.50 to \$22 per hour.

Future agenda items: Drainage District #9 response; Floyd County Fair liquor license renewal, and a use of courthouse grounds permit application.

Campbell/Rottinghaus moved to adjourn at 10:52 a.m. Motion carried 3-0.
